

Ray was an active participant in fundraising for local charities, including The Sheriff's Youth Ranch and CASA. While Ray's passion for golf and fishing made Citrus Hills a natural choice for his retirement years, his heart forever belongs to Boston and he remained an avid fan of the Patriots, Red Sox, Bruins and Celtics throughout his life. Ray was preceded in death by his son, Jonathan, and younger brother, Frank, and is survived by his beloved wife, Christine; dog Mimi; daughter-in-law Megan; two nieces and four nephews; all of whom will miss him tremendously. At Ray's request, no formal service or memorial celebration will be held; he preferred that people remember him in their own special way.
